My personal preference is for W&L to remain unisex. It is regrettable, I think that the rush to coeducation has become a sort of stampede. For many years, the unisex colleges for men and women served our country very well. I recognize, however, for the reasons you well state - particularly the problem of attracting the best qualified young people - that a strong argument can be made for the change. In view of my position on the Court, and possible legal consequences under some of our statutes, I am not an advocate of either point of view.
